A PARENT NEEDS THE COURAGE TO SAY "NO"

Many of our young people are lost in "space and time." With no standard in which they have confidence, they become neurotic, delinquent, cynical or apathetic, with no sense of values. This could be avoided if the standard of right and wrong was clearly indicated and consistently enforced. Loss of respect for people, self, and authority is a symptom of the real cause, which is lack of security. Security can only come when young people know exactly what they should and should not do and are convinced that the right way is the way to success and happiness, be cause of the example they see before them in the one who teaches them the standard.

The immature parent, who values his own feelings above the future of his child will rob that child of a secure basis upon which to build his life. "No" is an unpleasant word to a child, but this is a temporary unpleasantness. To the parent it is also a painful experience to say "No". The immature and selfish parent is unwilling to secure this pain. So, for his own temporary peace of mind, he relents and irreparably damages a life for which God has made him responsible and for which he will surely be judged.
